

Participation by the Public

The Board encourages and invites members of the community to participate in school affairs by voicing opinions and concerns at public meetings; working on budget, curriculum, personnel selection and other committees; volunteering as playground aides, tutors, chaperones, and other curricular and extracurricular assistants; and otherwise giving of their time and talents to the schools.

Many kinds of citizen participation are described in District policies. There are numerous special or temporary ways to take part in school decision-making and programs. Citizens with particular interests or talents are invited to contact any school office or the District Office to find how they may best participate.

Administrators are responsible for establishing procedures for making sure that volunteers in the schools are adequately oriented, trained, and supervised.
